From the Pastor

On Tuesday, the priests of the Green Bay Diocese will gather with Bishop Ricken at the Cathedral to renew our vows and commitment as priests. **I am so grateful for Fr. Dick Klingeisen and Fr. Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

The Sourcebook 2011, a reference used by the Worship Commission for the liturgical seasons states: "Palm Sunday as we celebrate it today is full of liturgical 'whiplash.'" There are many different moods that we feel throughout Holy Week. What a day of contrasts! The liturgy begins with the joyful waving of palm branches; the crowds proclaiming Jesus the Messiah as he rides into Jerusalem. It continues with the reading of the Passion, where the same crowds agree to his torture and crucifixion.

Matthew's Passion provides a huge picture, full of characters and incidents. No one seems to behave as one would expect. One scene of the Passion seems comparable to a scene in the popular musical, Les Miserables. Jean Valjean, imprisoned for 19 years for stealing a loaf of bread, realizes upon his release he will always bear the burden of a convict. Assuming a new identity, he leads a very successful life. However, Javert, the sheriff, is obsessed with tracking down this parole-breaker - prisoner 24601. When Javert believes he finally has him, rather than see an innocent man condemned, Jean Valjean confesses that he is prisoner 24601! Continuing to evade capture, Valjean becomes a fearless servant; a man of integrity and goodness. For Jean Valjean and Jesus, true identity is the crux of the matter.

As Jesus meets the soldiers He asks, "Whom are you seeking?" When they reply, "Jesus the Nazorean," He answers, "I am He." As He declares his identity, Matthew tells us that Jesus is fully aware of all that is to happen to Him. For His choice to abandon all, God lifts Jesus in glory. This is more than the "plot" of Holy Week; this is the very core of Christian life.

Say to daughter Zion, "Behold, your king comes to you, meek and riding on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden."

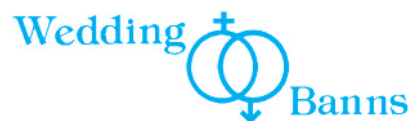

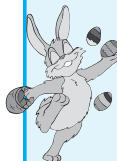
