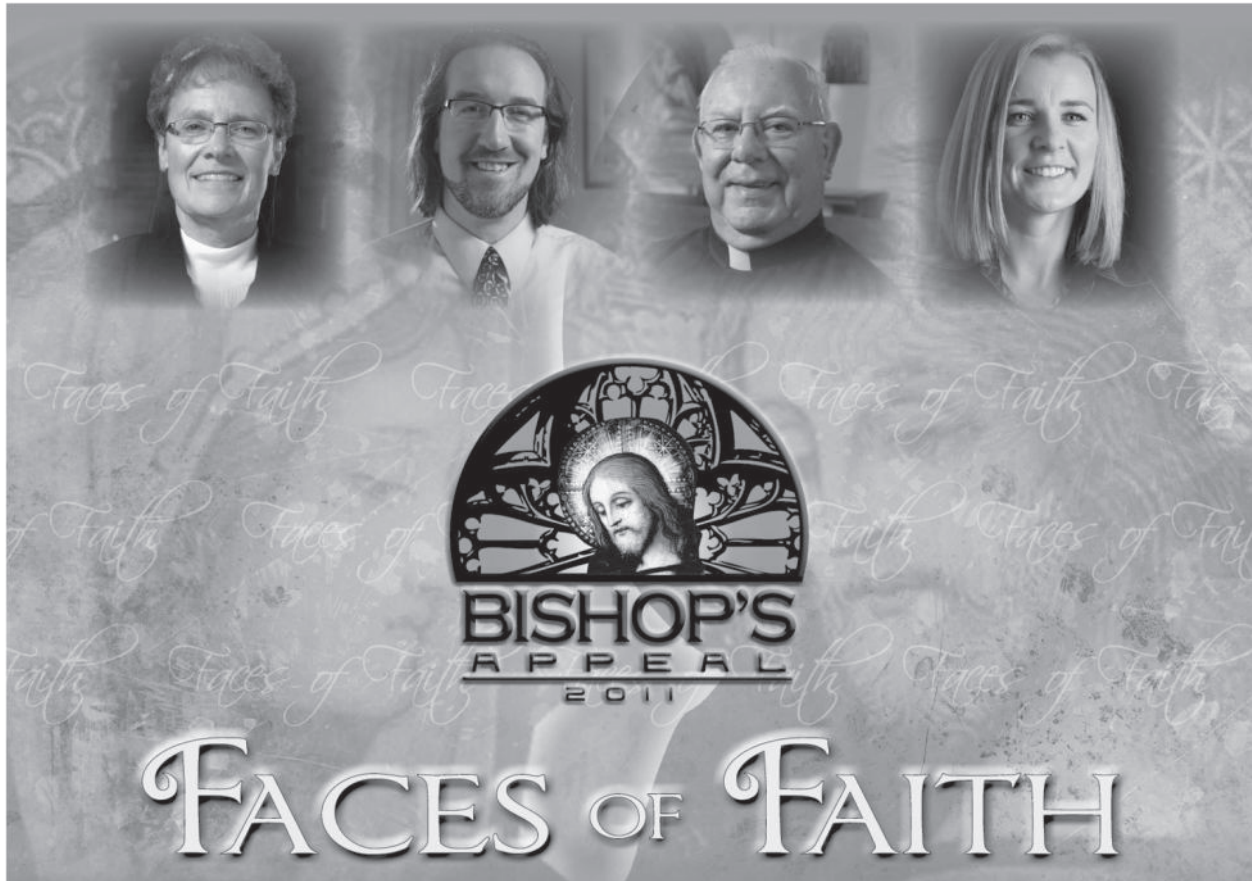
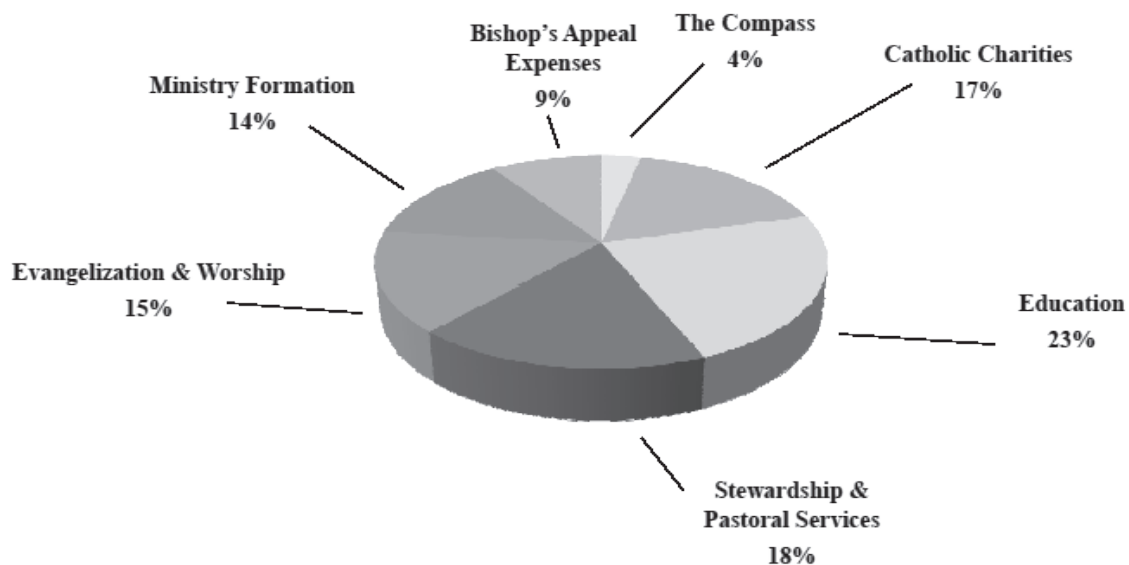

Dear Parishioners & Friends of the Parish,

Greetings to you as we quickly make our way through the month of February. Certainly the reprieve in the winter weather has been a most welcomed blessing!

This weekend, Joel Stepanek, our Director of Youth Ministry, and I are two of the fifty delegates that are gathering at the Monte Alverno Retreat House in Appleton for the **Diocesan Visioning Summit**. The focus of this Summit is to join Bishop Ricken in a process that will establish the vision and goals for our Diocese of Green Bay for the next five years.

If you remember, earlier this year we did a **survey in our parish** (along with every other parish in the diocese) as to what are our best examples of parish vitality and life and what are our hopes and dreams for parish life into the future. In our parish alone we had over 1375 surveys returned and collated. These were the results of those surveys:

Top five examples of **parish vitality and life**:

- Alive and vibrant celebrations of the Mass
- Celebration and spirit of the LifeTeen Mass
- Vibrancy and variation of music and singing at the Mass
- The involvement of the community in the ministry & mission of the parish & school
- Priest homilies

Top five **hopes and dreams for the future of our parish**:

- Get even more parishioners involved in the life of the parish
- Increase the number of parishioners who celebrate the Sunday Mass
- Enhance ministry of our youth, young adults and families
- Create more community building events
- Provide for a financial stability

These top five lists were sent to the Diocese and were added to the top five lists of all the other parishes throughout the diocese. In addition to the thousands of survey responses, there were also focus groups held in a variety of locations and interviews with diocesan leadership. The Summit this weekend will pull all of that feedback together and through prayerful discernment and dialogue bring forth the vision and goals that will carry the Diocese forward in the next five years.

Please keep us in your prayers, along with the others who will be a part of this Diocesan Visioning Summit!

If we felt like squirming after hearing last Sunday's Gospel, this week does not offer much relief! In fact, Jesus' continuation of the Sermon on the Mount raises the bar even higher when he says, "So be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect." Don't know about you, but I've had trouble with this one. I sometimes feel like I'm trying so hard already, yet I'll never be perfect. Thanks to the wisdom of scripture scholars, I have learned to appreciate the passage in the light of its true meaning.

Speaking to his disciples Jesus reinterprets the traditional law in a radical manner. No more "An eye for an eye" and "A tooth for a tooth." He teaches his disciples that members of God's family pattern their lives after God's love. They do not retaliate; rather they offer no resistance – and even love their enemies. Pretty radical in Jesus' time! Perhaps even in our own time with its repeated violence, abuse and killings. Yet, we have recently watched a riot erupt in Egypt, and a hope of freedom unfold. A revolution is never peaceful, but we have not heard reports of mindless bloodshed. Gandhi, Martin Luther King, Jr., and so many people in our history have sought to live a life of non-violence in a world filled with many forms of terrorism.

So, back to the beginning! Jesus set the standard pretty high when he said, "Be perfect..." We are called to bear a "family resemblance" to God. How can we do that? We know that God is a loving, caring, comforting, merciful and forgiving God. When we seek to love extravagantly, care without cost, comfort those in need, and strive to be merciful and forgiving to all, we are mirroring God in our daily living. We are a reflection of God.

"You have heard that it was said, You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father."
 - Mt 5:43-45a

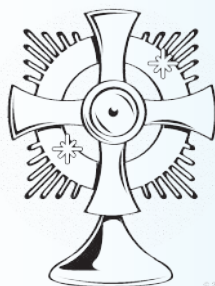

PILGRIMAGE FOR LIFE

Tiffany Bowring : I cannot express how grateful I am for being given the opportunity to participate in the pilgrimage to Washington DC. Marching with hundreds of thousands of people that share the same passion as I do was truly an experience of a lifetime.

Katie Schetter: The Pilgrimage for Life was an experience I will never forget! There were so many of us backing each other on what we believe in it was truly amazing. I am so grateful that I was able to go on this trip and I hope that more people from our parish may want to join us in the future for this great cause.

Joleen Wilhelm: For the past four years, I have had the opportunity to go on the March for Life Pilgrimage to Washington D.C. What stood out this year was going to *Planned Parenthood* and praying outside the abortion clinic there. This brought a sense of reality and urgency to the pro-life fight. Abortion is not just a word or an idea, but is a very depressing reality.



March 9 to April 17, 2011

Christians throughout Manitowoc County are invited to take part in the national **40 DAYS FOR LIFE CAMPAIGN** from March 9 through April 17. There are 3 components to the campaign:

1. **PRAYER** for an end to abortion - any day or several times a day; at home, or on your way to or from work or school or in church or where ever you are. It takes only a second to whisper a prayer for this vital cause. It can also serve as a back-up for those keeping vigil outside the abortion clinic.
2. **FASTING** for an end to abortion - from food, a favorite food or a favorite activity - anyone of any age can do this!!
3. **PEACEFUL PRAYER VIGIL** outside of the Medical Arts Building, 704 S. Webster St., Green Bay, WI., the site of OB-Gyn Associates of Green Bay. This is a 24 hour prayer vigil on the public sidewalk around the clinic. The block of time from 10 a.m. to 12 noon on all Saturdays from March 12 to April 16 has been designated as prayer vigil time for Manitowoc county Christians. You are welcome to join other groups at other times if that fits your schedule better.
