## Epiphany of the Lord

Today celebrates the day that the Gentile magi came to adore Jesus. The fact that they are Gentiles is important, because in the world as we know it, there are many who are Gentile in origin and others who profess other religious beliefs who are often judged to be outside of God's love. Yet the plan of God was to manifest Himself to all. This universal gift of His love is what is celebrated on this feast of the Epiphany. This gift of love addresses the exclusivity and sin that leads to bitterness and at times violence seen throughout the world.

Admittedly, applying this gift of God's love to all people is challenging. There are many who find it difficult to accept other races, creeds and languages. This feast would suggest that we work through our differences. The current concerns about Muslims and their beliefs and the response of others to them provides an area of reflection in applying the lesson of God's universal love. Another group would be the immigrants, especially the Hispanic people who live in the United States and in our own county. In order to apply the principle of God's universal love, the best place to start is to look for the good in all religious traditions, cultures and peoples. This is an on-going work. It will take much work and prayer. I am reminded of St. Paul's message to pray always. By our prayer the Spirit of God, a spirit of love, will be present in all people.

As a Christian family we continue to celebrate the Christmas season. The heart of this season is God's love for His people as shown by the birth of His son, Jesus. May the lessons of this season bring good results within each of us, the parish, the community and the world.

## **GIFTS OF THE MAGI AND STEWARDSHIP**



The Epiphany celebrates the coming of the Magi, who were non-Jews, to worship the child Jesus. It is thus a missionary feast because Jesus is not only the Jewish Messiah but also the Savior of the whole human race.

But the Epiphany is a **stewardship** celebration, as well, for the Magi did not come empty-handed. They brought gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh to offer Him. Gold represents **sharing** that we present to our spiritual King for the spread of the Kingdom of God. Frankincense symbolizes our devotion to **prayer** and the worship of God. And myrrh conveys our willingness to offer our **service** to others, for it is used in preparing bodies for burial, a service the Church has identified for centuries as one of the corporal works of mercy.

The Epiphany, then, challenges us to be good Christian stewards and to bring our sharing, prayer and service to worship Jesus, just as the Magi did, and to invite others to join us in worship.
