From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners & Friends of the Parish,

Greetings to you in as the power and the presence of the Holy Spirit! Today, along with the apostles of old, we are to be bold in our witness to the Lord to all that we would meet. Having deepened that relationship with Jesus Christ for fifty days, we now want to go out into the world and invite others into that same relationship. **That is our mission: to call others into a relationship with Christ and the Church as the Body of Christ.**

We are presently in a rearrangement of our St. Francis of Assisi Catholic School buildings. Next fall, the SFA Catholic Elementary School campus (P-4) will be located at the Waldo site and our SFA Catholic Middle School campus (5-8) will be at the Marshall site. This transition will bring about the closure of the Xavier School campus. **With this rearrangement of buildings we will optimize our resources and cut our costs while maintaining a high quality of academic and spiritual education.** In the fall, the Xavier School building will go through the process that has been put into place when a building becomes available – the first step being an internal and external evaluation of how the space is presently used and what potential there is for new usage.

Next Saturday, at the Grand Avenue worship site 4:00pm Mass, we will celebrate the history and heritage of St. Andrew/Xavier School. We will lift up with gratitude all of the students, families, staff, administrators and pastors who have hallowed the halls of this school building since its establishment in 1928. **At this special Mass there will be a media presentation, photographs and a social afterwards with an opportunity to tour the building.** Come and join us for this special event!

This coming week you will receive a letter informing you of your Stewardship Giving to our parish through May 31, 2011. The reason for this letter is that our parish fiscal year comes to an end on June 30, 2011. Many parishioners wait until June to give their parish stewardship support. **To date, our parish expenses are under budget due to our diligent monitoring of expenses. However, our stewardship revenue is also under budget by about \$65,000.** As a parish we have control over our expenses, but only you have control over your stewardship giving. We need all parishioners to re-evaluate the portion of their blessings that they are giving back to God in gratitude for the many blessings in their lives. It is this portion of blessings returned that accounts for how we will carry out the Kingdom Mission that has been entrusted to us as a parish community.

I am happy to report that we are within \$7000 of our Bishop's Appeal assessment of \$187,000. If you have yet to give to the Bishop's Appeal please do so as soon as is possi-

Do you remember a time when people rarely locked their doors – even in larger cities? Life was perhaps simpler then, and neighbors looked out for each other. Now we might not even know our neighbors. Frequently neighborhoods tend to be marked by fear. Our doors are locked, sometimes even more than once. We pay for security systems; some people live in gated communities. Fear may have become a way of life for us.

As John recounts in today's Gospel, the disciples were in a locked room because they were afraid. Humanly speaking, they had every right to be! Fear usually accompanies a serious breakdown in relationships. In contrast, forgiveness begins a serious attempt to rebuild relationships. It is no surprise, then, that on this resurrection night appearance, Jesus gives this jittery group of followers the gift of peace, of the Holy Spirit, and then sends them out on a mission of forgiveness.

To forgive is perhaps the hardest thing we humans do. Every day we seek or give forgiveness. Every day we choose to build right relationships or not, to open doors between ourselves and others or close them, to allow the peace of Christ to replace the fears that stifle our connection to one another. More than a simple apology, this forgiveness often requires a change of heart - a change of heart that could open the door for peace within our family, our church, our world.

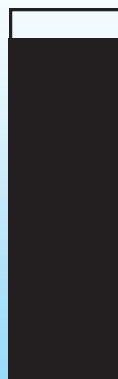

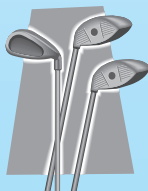
