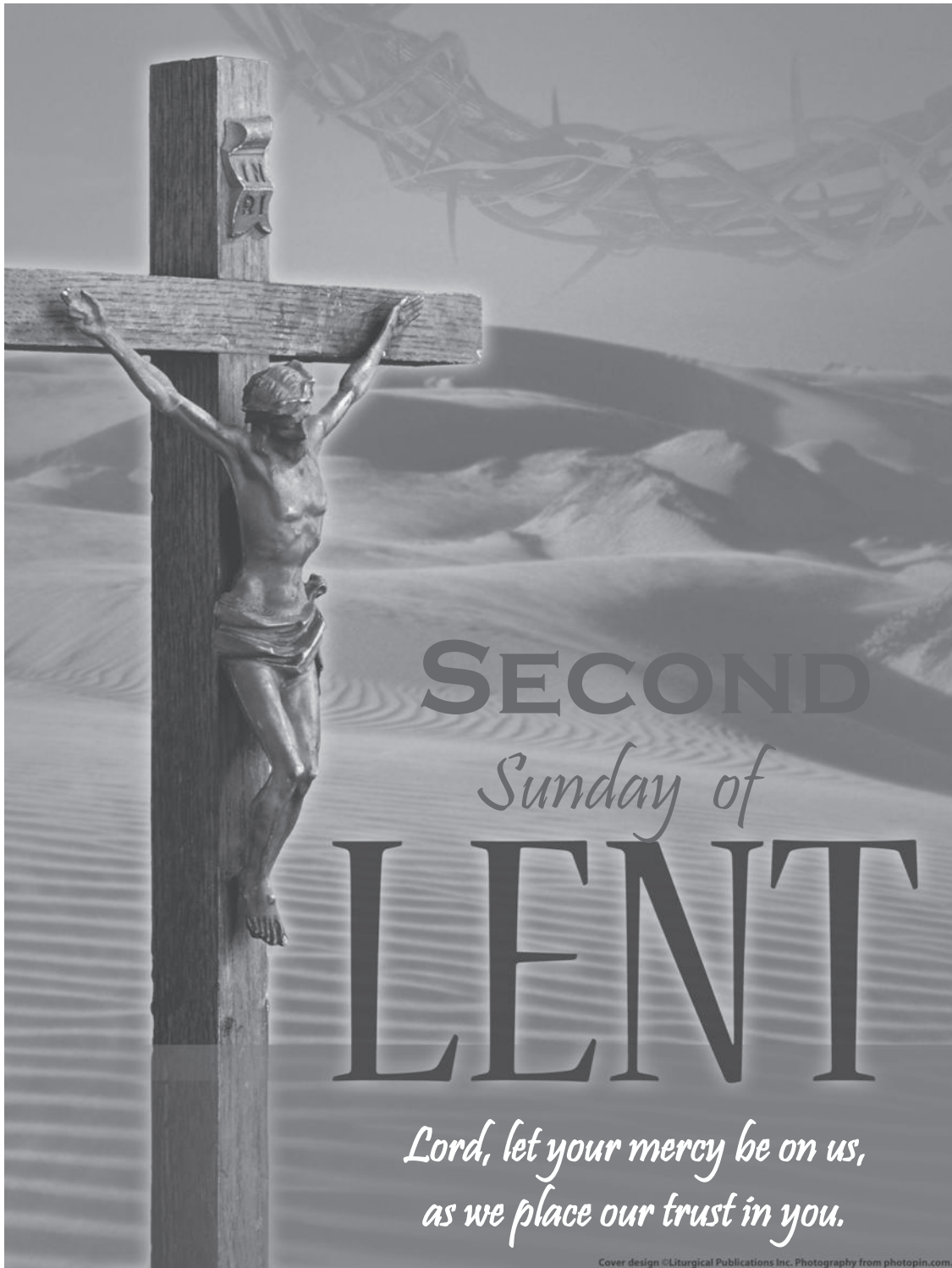

## From the Pastor

Dear Parishioners & Friends of the Parish,

There is a wonderful Lenten Preface that is prayed in the Mass that states, **“Father, each year you give us this joyful season when we prepare to celebrate the paschal mystery with mind and heart renewed.”** Often we think of Lent as a somber season. However, when we are about renewing our heart and mind and embrace the fullness of God’s love revealed to us in the paschal mystery of Jesus Christ we are anything but somber... it is *a joyful season*.

**We rejoice that we have the beautiful Sacrament of Reconciliation.** The reception of this Sacrament invites us to come to the Lord with a contrite mind and heart so that through the grace of our God we might be renewed and all of our sins forgiven. Imagine that ... every sin that we have ever committed cleansed from our soul, so that we might begin the journey anew. This week we will begin our Parish & School wide celebrations of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. You are invited to participate in any one of these services.

**We rejoice in our Lenten call to Retreat during these 40 days of Lent so that we may know how best to grow in holiness.** This week Dr. Stacey Soeldner will lead a Retreat for Women. All the women of our parish are invited to this Retreat, along with any women friends or family members that you may want to invite to join you. As the women reflect upon what it means to be “Full of Grace,” their mind and heart will be renewed.

**We rejoice that we have been given an ancient Lenten tradition of praying the Stations of the Cross.** Stations of the Cross (or Way of the Cross; in Latin, Via Crucis; also called the Via Dolorosa or Way of Sorrows, or simply, The Way) refers to the depiction of the final hours of Jesus and the devotion commemorating the Passion. The tradition as chapel devotion began with St. Francis of Assisi and extended throughout the Roman Catholic Church in the medieval period. Come and join us or any parish in our county for praying with mind and heart this ancient devotion.

**Truly this is a joyful season as we prepare to celebrate the paschal mystery with minds and hearts renewed!**

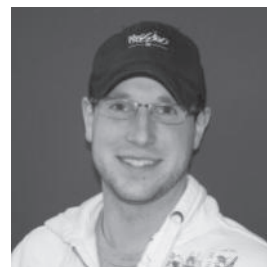

## Second Sunday Of Lent

I have wondered what that face looks like, the face of the transfigured Christ. What was it that Peter, James and John saw that made Peter want to stay up on that mountaintop? Perhaps it was simply the reality that in that moment they were gazing on the face of God, as close as anyone could ever come to gazing upon the face of God without dying, and they didn't want to look away.

Often times this particular passage is used to talk about going out into the world, as Peter, James, and John did, to share that reality of the transfigured Christ to everyone, but I have a challenge that I issue to myself and to you this Lenten season. How often are we taking the time to go up to the mountain? Are we allowing ourselves the opportunity to even see that face of Christ this Lent? Or, in the busyness of our lives and schedules are we simply ignoring the invitation Christ is giving us to climb up and see Him for who He is. Are we giving ourselves the moments necessary to understand that He is Lord and Messiah? Or are we reducing him to an idea, or a story, and in doing so making Him irrelevant?

This Lent our Lord Jesus invites us to the mountain so we can see Him as He is truly. He calls us out of our daily routines and schedules to make a moment to gaze upon His face, to be in His presence, and to rest. Peter, James, and John entered into this moment with our Lord and were forever changed. May we mirror that change in our lives this Lent.

Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him.

### **An organized way to serve... in work that works to rebuild!**

Rebuilding Together Manitowoc County, Inc.



At a recent St. Francis of Assisi Stewardship Service Team meeting a "Community Service Days" event was discussed. The types of projects centered around tasks that can be done at the homes of people in our community that could not do the tasks on their own.

An organization called "Rebuilding Together Manitowoc County, Inc." is operational in our community and provides assistance to low-income homeowners and non-profit organizations. Their primary purpose is to help homeowners remain in their homes. The organization is comprised entirely of volunteers. The Rebuilding Together board does selection of homes to be rehabilitated based on qualifications, budget constraints, and extent of work needed.

The skills required by these project teams vary from basic clean-up tasks, both in-doors and out, to carpentry, electrician, and plumbing skills. The skills required are matched to the volunteers' skills.

The home improvements of the selected homes are normally accomplished in one day. This requires several teams to be working at several locations simultaneously. This year's event will happen on Saturday, April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2011. If you are interested in helping for the entire day or a few hours, please contact (by April 12<sup>th</sup>):
