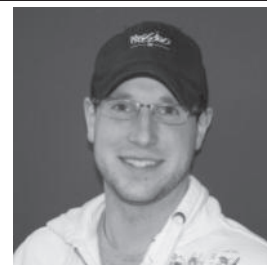

Don't talk to strangers. It's a philosophy that every child is brought up with, and a phrase common to parents who are striving to keep them safe. Be wary of the voice you don't recognize, cautious around those who say they were sent by your parents unless they know a "code" word, and always walk home from school with a friend. These common practices are vitally important for safety's sake, and are nearly universal.

Jesus acknowledges those practices today in the Gospel by stating the obvious "they will not follow the voice of a stranger, rather, they will run from him." On the contrary, Jesus says that those who know His voice will follow Him, the True Voice and True God. This is why the work our parish does with youth is so important.

This generation of teens has been raised with the common practices of not talking to strangers, but we have to ask ourselves if we have given them the opportunity to hear the voice of Christ. As parents, have you helped your children understand that Jesus loves them and wants a relationship with them? As a family, have you taken time to read scripture together and learn as a community?

As parishioners, when we see young people at church are we welcoming to them so, as the song goes, "they will know we are Christians by our love?" Too often we forget these basic things, and then we wonder why we see fewer youth in our churches, fewer teens believing in God, and teens falling away from the Church. The answer is simple, they will not listen to the voice of a stranger, and for many of them, they have never heard the voice of Christ. So they run.

The good news is that they don't have to, we as a community can help them hear that voice so Jesus is no longer "stranger" but "friend," and in doing so we, along with the youth, can experience the promise Jesus makes to all who follow Him, the Good Shepherd, that they will have life, and have it more abundantly.

"I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly." - Jn 10:9-10
